

4.	What made Stephen feel nervous as he stood by the gates wondering what to do next?	(2 marks)
5.	Why do you think Stephen eventually grabbed the large rusty handles?	(2 marks)
6.	Why did Stephen wait for a little while before closing the gates behind him?	(2 marks)

7.	What do you think was making the strange calling sound? Explain the reasons for your answer.	(3 marks)
8.	How do you know from the passage that Stephen was frightened by the strange calls?	(2 marks)
9.	Why do you think Stephen gave 'an enormous sigh' before he carried on walking along the path inside the gates?	(2 marks)
10	Why do you think Stephen is so desperate to get through the gates and to carry on walking up the path? Explain your answer in detail, giving reasons for your ideas and answers.	(3 marks)
